




How it Works

<p>Share a fantasy world book with your child, for example, The BFG by Roald Dahl or Room on the Broom by Julia Donaldson. Discuss what they can see in the pictures in the book.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>	<p>Go to the shop together and support them to pay for their treat e.g. packet of crisps or a book. How many coins do we need? Do we need to wait for change?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>	<p>Go to the park and try out different pieces of equipment - which one is your favourite? Why do you like it? Does it scare you?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>	<p>Play a game of Simon Says and request a range of actions - hands up, touch the ground, sit down, crawl like a baby etc. Can they follow instructions and complete the range of moves?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>	<p>Go to the local art gallery and look at all the different examples of art on display. Can you see pictures of people? Can you see pictures of animals? Can you see pictures of buildings? What colours are used?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★</p>
<p>Listen and respond to a range of nursery rhymes. Share known rhymes encouraging your child to move along to/vocalise to the rhyme.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★</p>	<p>Go for a walk in the park and do some simple counting as you go along - how many girls can you see? How many trees can you see? How many ducks can you see?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★</p>	<p>Play a game that you know your child enjoys and is good at. Support them to recognise this game as something they enjoy doing and how it makes them happy.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★</p>	<p>Can you practise dancing with a sibling or a parent. Can you copy the moves? Can you stop when the music stops? Can you combine two moves to create a sequence?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★</p>	<p>Go for a walk around your garden - can you find different coloured flowers and leaves? Can you bring your finds into school so that we can use them during an Art lesson to create different patterns.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★</p>
<p>Share a YouTube video of the fantasy books listed to above. What can they see, hear? What is the character doing?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★★</p>	<p>Do some cooking with your child and support them to measure out the ingredients. Can you pour flour to 200g? Do you need more or less?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★★</p>	<p>Play a family game together e.g. Snakes and Ladders. Encourage turn taking, waiting for a turn. Can they talk about what they are doing? Can they follow the rules of the game?</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★★</p>	<p>Go to the park and use the playground equipment. Can you climb the bars? Can you climb the ladder? Can you move yourself on the roundabout? Can you go higher on the swing? Take pictures to share with your friends in class.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">★★★</p>	<p>During a visit to the hospital, doctors surgery or clinic, discuss who we can see. Can we see nurses?
